DC Board of Dentistry Updates

DC Board of Dentistry Adopts Policy for Greatly Reduced Financial Penalties When Unregistered Dental Assistants Come Forward to Register Through 12/31/2023

All dental assistants who work in DC are required to register with the Board of Dentistry. Over the past year the Board of Dentistry imposed fines on dental practices and dental assistants when it learned of unregistered dental assistants working in DC. Fines can range as high at \$5,000 on each dental assistant and \$30,000 on the dentist/dental practice.

DCDS is your advocate. We called upon the Board of Dentistry to suspend penalties to allow unregistered dental assistants to come forward to register with the Board. We also called for an end to the registration requirement for Level I dental assistants. To date, that proposal has not been accepted.

Recently the Board of Dentistry adopted the <u>Policy on Incentivized Time Period for Registration of Dental Assistants</u> to allow unregistered dental assistants who have been working in DC to register with greatly reduced financial penalties assessed.

- The policy will remain in effect until 12/31/2023.
- The <u>Incentivized Dental Assistant Registration Cover Letter</u> ("Cover Letter") must be submitted with a registration application in order to be covered by this policy.
- The penalty imposed on each dental assistant will be \$250 when they apply.
- The penalty for supervising dentists/dental practices will be \$500 per unregistered dental assistant.
- Dental assistants and dentists covered by this policy will be required to complete 2 continuing education hours in ethics.
- The Cover Letter includes the disclaimer that it "cannot be used against me for any other purpose," which provides the unregistered dental assistant and dentist/dental practice with protection from higher fines related to the employment of an unregistered dental assistant.

Dental Assistant Incentivized Registration Application Cover Letter

Unregistered dental assistants should apply to register with the Board of Dentistry through the <u>DC Health Licensing Portal</u>. If this is the first time they attempt to register, dental assistants will be eligible to submit the <u>90 Day Supervised Practice Form</u> that allows them to practice for 90 days, upon approval by the Board of Dentistry, while the application is under review.


2023 License/Registration Renewals

2023 is a license/registration renewal year. All applications to renew a license or registration to practice dentistry in DC must be submitted through the DC Health Licensing Portal. The portal is now accepting renewal applications from dentists, dental hygienists and dental assistants. DC Health strongly encourages all users to review the instructions prior to beginning the process. License renewal applications must be submitted by December 31, 2023.

Board of Dentistry Clarifies Criminal Background Requirement

A criminal background check (CBC) will be required for license/registration renewal submissions in 2023 (fee of \$50). The Board of Dentistry recently clarified that the requirement will be dependent upon the type of application submitted. The table below summarizes how the requirement will be implemented.

Application Type	Method of Criminal Background Check
Renewal	Name search—include the applicant's gender, Social Security number, date of birth, and mailing address No fingerprint required.
New License/ Registration	Fingerprint Fingerprint may be taken by traditional roll method or live/electronic scan.
Reinstatement/ Reactivation	Fingerprint Fingerprint may be taken by traditional roll method or live/electronic scan.

About the Program

The District's Address Confidentiality Program (ACP), administered by the Office of Victim Services and Justice Grants (OVSJG), helps people at risk of harm stay safe by shielding their street address from public records. ACP services are intended as one tool in an individual's broader safety plan.

This free program provides participants with:

- A legal substitute address to protect their home, work, or school address
- A confidential mail-forwarding service.



Who Is It For?

You may qualify for the ACP if you:

- fear for your safety;
- (2) currently (or will soon) reside in the District of Columbia; AND
- Have experienced domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking;
 - Are employed by an organization whose primary purpose is serving victims who have experienced the above offenses; OR
 - Are employed by an organization that focuses on reproductive healthcare.

Applicants are also required to: have moved within the past 60 days, be planning to move within the next 30 days, or have taken adequate measures to ensure their current address is not easily accessible online or through public records. Both adults and children may qualify.



How to Apply

Application assistants are available in several agencies across the District to answer questions, verify eligibility, and accept applications. They also can provide advocacy services and help you develop a comprehensive safety plan based on your individual needs.

How Does the ACP Work?

Substitute Address

Applicants who qualify receive an ACP **authorization card** with a substitute address. This card can be presented to any DC agency in place of your real home, work, or school address. Authorization cards are initially valid for 3 years.

With this legal substitute address you can interact with DC agencies without fear of your actual address appearing in public records. With a substitute address you can:

- Get a DC driver's license or ID card
- Enroll children in DC public/charter school
- Vote and sign petitions

While only District agencies are required to honor the substitute address, placing it on a DC driver's license or ID card will protect your actual address in many day-to-day situations.

Mail Forwarding

When first-class, certified, or registered mail is received at the substitute address, it is forwarded to your home address.

Limitations

A substitute address does not guarantee your actual address will not be required by other non-government agencies. Your real address will still be required for certain activities, including:

- Purchasing a home or property. (Note that the address may appear in related public listings.)
- Applying for a line of credit on your home.
- Setting up utilities for your home.

Additionally, the ACP does not forward junk mail, packages, or magazines; an advocate or application assistant can help you plan for safely receiving that mail. Other limitations may also apply.


