Letter from the DC Dental Society President Ioana "Anna" Bettios, DDS, MS, FACP, FICD, FACD

Dear Colleagues,

I hope all are enjoying the summer with your families and taking some much-needed time off to recharge in wonderful places around the country.

Our overarching goal for this year when the Board of Directors meets again in September is to review and up-

date our strategic plan and continue to move forward our strategic priorities that were revamped in 2021. A key initiative is to advocate on behalf of members, particularly before the Board of Dentistry and the DC Council. We understand there is an ongoing shortage of dental hygienists and dental assistants, causing many DC dentists to struggle to find qualified dental staff. That is why we are advocating for changes to DC laws and regulations to make it easier for dental professionals to come to work in DC.

DCDS is advocating for a repeal of the requirement that all Level I dental assistants must register with the Board of Dentistry. This requirement puts DC dental practices at a disadvantage with practices in Maryland and Virginia, where only dental assistants who perform advanced functions are required to register.

DCDS believes that DC should enter reciprocal licensing agreements with Maryland and Virginia to expedite the process of putting qualified dental professionals to work in DC that are licensed in our neighboring states.

DCDS has asked the Board of Dentistry to refrain from imposing financial penalties on any unregistered dental assistants currently working in DC and the dental practices who employ them. We were clear in our submission that we agree that dental assistants and practices need to be in compliance with DC regulations, but we requested the Board of Dentistry to grant a period of time

Advocacy Update

DCDS calls for reforms to expand access to staff and streamline licensing process at DC Council oversight hearing

In testimony before a June 8 Oversight Hearing on the Board of Dentistry held by the DC Council Committee on Health, DC Dental Society Executive Director Kurt Gallagher offered a number of recommendations to increase the availability of dental staff in DC. In the testimony, he stated "One of the biggest challenges facing dental practices remains the ability to secure staffing. DC has in place statutes, regulations and a fee structure that discourages potential dental care workers from choosing the District as their place of employment." Key recommendations included:

- Repealing the requirement that all Level I dental assistants must register with the Board of Dentistry, which puts DC dental practices at a disadvantage with practices in Maryland and Virginia, where only dental assistants who perform advanced functions are required to register.
- DC should enter reciprocal licensing agreements with Maryland and Virginia to expedite the process of putting qualified dental professionals to work in DC that are licensed in our neighboring states.
- Asking the Board of Dentistry to refrain from imposing financial penalties on any unregistered dental
 assistants currently working in DC and the dental practices who employ them for a period of one year
 so that unregistered dental assistants can register without penalty.
- Reducing DC licensing and registration fees, which overall are higher in DC than in Maryland and Virginia, particularly when including the cost of a criminal background check and considering that the equivalent of Level I dental assistants are not required to register in Maryland or Virginia.
- The Board of Dentistry can improve communication with applicants by providing a comprehensive list of deficiencies with an application that are identified upon review.
- The Board of Dentistry should regularly report meaningful statistics on licensing trends.

DC Board of Dentistry moves to create expanded function dental assistant category, adopting DCDS recommendations

The DC Board of Dentistry has proposed rules to create a Level III Dental assistant authorized to perform coronal polishing, place pit and fissure sealants, and conduct glucose testing. The authorization for certified dental assistants to perform these expanded functions would result in implementation of recommendations offered by the DC Dental Society in 2022. DCDS submitted comments in support of the proposal to authorize the expanded functions for certified dental assistants.

DCDS comments also provided practical perspective on two proposed additions to the list of procedures that dentists would not longer be permitted to delegate if adopted: placement of a liquid dam and whitening or bleaching (internal, laser or high-intensity). The DCDS letter noted that dental hygienists and dental assistants can be trained to safely place a liquid dam and administer whitening or bleaching that is not internal under the direct supervision of a dentist.

DCDS will share information on the regulations when finalized.

for all practices to ensure compliance and avoid hefty fines. This remains an ongoing request before the Board of Dentistry. The <u>current DC Municipal Regulations for Dental Assistants</u> are available on the DC Health website.

DCDS has called for a reduction in DC licensing and registration fees. Overall registration fees for dental hygienists and dental assistants are significantly higher in DC than in our neighboring states, particularly when including the cost of a criminal background check and considering that the equivalent of Level I dental assistants are not required to register in Maryland or Virginia.

We testified at an oversight hearing conducted by the DC Council Committee on Health on the Board of Dentistry on June 8 where we highlighted the issues noted above along with other (read-testimony). We will continue our strategic priority to advocate for dental providers to stop the loss of dental staff to neighboring states. Several DCDS board and committee members, along with our Executive Director, provided public comments during the Board of Dentistry meeting on June 19 about the ongoing challenges in securing dental staff. More dental assisting training programs are needed in the DC area, as well as more outreach to local high schools to encourage students to apply for dental assisting and hygiene programs. The Board of Dentistry also suggested that dental practices submit a 90 Day Supervised Practice Form for Dental Assistants when an assistant applies to register. If approved by the Board of Dentistry, this form will allow the assistant to practice for up to 90 days while the application is under review.

In addition, we have a strategic goal to grow the number of dentists who are members of our society. Particularly when it comes to advocacy, there is strength in numbers.

As discussed during our last DCDS board of directors meeting, as a Society we already provide many programs that support the success of our members in their careers, including with professional educational and social events, but we also need to programs diversify and meet the needs and wants of our new and mid-career dentists to continue to attract and retain members.

We are honored that several members have expressed an interest in serving on committees. A roster of recommendations is being sent to the board for review and vote prior to announcing the appointments. We still have a few of positions available on the Membership and Social Media Committees. We encourage members with creative and innovative ideas

DCDS Proposed Bylaws Amendments

DCDS proposed bylaws amendments are scheduled for a membership vote during the September 14 business meeting before the continuing education presentation. The <u>proposed bylaws amendments</u> will:

- Affirm the right of members to participate in elections via electronic ballot, including votes on future bylaws amendments.
- Grant the board of directors the flexibility to establish new committees, or disband them, to enable an agile organizational structure that can better meet member needs.
- Specify that elected officers and board members will be announced at the last meeting of the fiscal year. Officers shall assume the responsibilities of their respective offices on January 1st of the following year.
- Affirm that the membership may conduct business via an electronic meeting.
- Specify that the Annual Awards Meeting will be held as the first meeting of the year.

Dental community asked to urge Congress to support Dental and Optometric Care Access Act

The ADA encourages members of the dental community to urge Congress to pass the <u>Dental and Optometric Care Access Act</u>, which would prevent dental and vision plans from determining fees that dentists can charge enrollees for services that are not covered, create network provider participation rules and maintain freedom of choice in laboratories, among other measures. "As you know, noncovered services provisions in dental and vision plans disadvantage enrollees, doctors and the public at large because they interfere with the patient-doctor relationship, skew the pricing charged to nonsubscribers and encourage the consolidation of the dental and vision insurance industries, resulting in higher premiums overall," said ADA President George R. Shepley, D.D.S.

Research spotlights gaps in opioid disorder therapy

US deaths related to opioid use have increased in recent years, rising from 51,000 in 2019 to 81,000 in 2021, and a study of Medicaid patients shows that fewer than half of those diagnosed get medication to treat the disorder. The research, published in <u>JAMA Health Forum</u>, examined data from adults in 46 states, Washington, D.C., and Puerto Rico over a three-year period, with co-author Dennis McCarty, Ph.D., noting that medication is considered the appropriate treatment for nearly all individuals with the disorder. The ADA offers information and resources on the opioid crisis.

ADA to offer new Dental Claim Form in 2024

A new version of the ADA Dental Claim Form is coming in 2024 that addresses a problem encountered when filing claims for services delivered by a "locum tenens" dentist -- one who is standing in for another while away from the practice for a short time. The form also provides space for reporting other data that can expedite timely claim adjudication and reimbursement as well as the national identifier assigned to third-party payers, known as payer ID. ADA publishes guidance on caries restorations

ADA Morning Huddle, June 27, 2023

A new ADA clinical guideline on restorative treatments for caries lesions, published in <u>The Journal of the American Dental Association</u>, includes 16 recommendations for treating moderate or advanced caries lesions in primary and permanent teeth without a history of endodontic treatment. The guidance associated conservative approaches to removing carious tissue with a lower risk of adverse effects and is based on data in a systematic review and meta-analysis published in <u>JADA</u> earlier in 2023.
