Letter from the DC Dental Society President Ioana "Anna" Bettios, DDS, MS, FACP, FICD, FACD

Dear Colleagues,

June historically has been the month when the term of office for the DCDS president, other officers and board members change, but as a result of the recent changes in bylaws, I am honored to serve as president until the end of the year. The change in leadership for our Society will continue to occur during the Annual Awards Meeting, which

is now scheduled to be held as the last meeting of the year.

What a year it has been this far! Our Society has engaged in initiatives on every front: continuing education events, social gatherings with families and staff, membership happy hours, legislative and advocacy efforts, and social media improvement. More great things are coming with new initiatives and changes proposed by the Bylaws Committee. These changes are scheduled for a membership vote during the September CE course on September 14. The proposed bylaws amendment will affirm the right of members to participate in elections via electronic ballot, including on votes for future bylaws amendments, and will grant the board of directors the flexibility to establish new committees, or disband them, to enable an agile organizational structure that can better meet member needs. their exceptional support to our Society, working many hours behind the scenes to secure venues and schedule events, making every step of the process run smoothly for myself, the committees and the members. They are most deserving of the award. The awards will also be included during the Annual Awards Meeting for formal recognition.

I would like to congratulate one of our past presidents, Dr. Chris Loukaitis, who received a Distinguished Faculty Award for his more than 25 years of educational achievements at the Howard University College of Dentistry. This award was presented at the Annual Honors and Awards ceremony held during Howard's graduation last month (see photo on page 6).

On the advocacy front, the executive director and several members attended the May 19th Board of Dentistry meeting and continue to advocate on behalf of our members for licensure improvements and expanded scope of practice. Most of the recommendations DCDS offered to the board of dentistry to allow dentists and dental assistants to perform more procedures have been incorporated into the draft regulations, including a recently published proposed regulation that would create a Level III dental assistant with the ability to perform coronal polishing and apply pit and fissure sealants.

Of great surprise was the recent communication from DC Health stating that a criminal background check (CBC) will be required for licensure renewal. The email communication sent on May 25 states "A person renewing his or her license, registration, or certification shall be required to undergo a fingerprint scan CBC or a CBC based on a name search, which shall include the applicant's gender, Social Security number, date of birth, and mailing address. The CBC shall occur at a two (2) year interval coinciding with the renewal date of the respective profession." DCDS is researching whether other states have similar requirements in place for licensure renewal. The Public Policy Committee is currently reviewing options and developing a letter to send to DC Health to outline our concerns.

DCDS recently submitted a letter supporting the Prior Authorization Amendments Act of 2023 (BN-0124) to the DC Council Committee on Health. The draft legislation would establish new rights for patients and healthcare providers with respect to the prior authorization process used by insurance companies to assess whether certain care will be covered by insurance in advance of delivery of that care. The legislation would also establish deadlines for insurance companies to respond to prior authorization requests and appeals in the event an initial request is denied. DCDS is calling upon the DC Council to clarify that the legislation will also protect patients when they seek dental care and to expand the legislation to hold insurance companies accountable to their promise to pay for prior authorized care.







Board of Dentistry Survey

Dentist and Dental Facility Certification to Administer Sedation or General Anesthesia

The District of Columbia Board of Dentistry ("Board") is developing the administrative framework for implementing the Dentist and Dental Facility Certification to Administer Sedation or General Anesthesia in the District of Columbia. As a licensed dentist in the District of Columbia, your feedback to the survey will help the Board develop an effective and efficient certification process. The survey will remain open until <u>June 20, 2023</u>.

The Board will grant one (1) Continuing Education Unit (CEU) for reviewing the <u>Dentist and Dental Facility</u> <u>Certification to Administer Sedation or General Anesthesia regulations</u> **and** for completing the survey. The one (1) CEU credit will only be accepted by the Board for the licensure renewal period ending December 31, 2023 for licensed dentist in the District of Columbia eligible for renewal. The CEU may not be used in any other jurisdiction.

 year. Officers shall assume the responsibilities of their respective offices on January 1st of the following year.
- Affirm that the membership may conduct business via an electronic meeting.
- Specify that the Annual Awards Meeting will be held as the first meeting of the year.

DC Dental Cares is a program of the DC Dental Society Foundation that coordinates pro bono dental care to members of the Washington Community in need. This program is administered under a partnership with the Catholic Charities Health Care Network. Through this program, DC dentists provide care in their own office with no long term commitment. The type and amount of treatment rendered to these patients is entirely at the discretion of the dentist. Patients are prescreened for eligibility based on their economic status. Participating dentists receive a referral outlining the patient's general oral health needs and their chief concern.





House passes HALT Fentanyl Act

ADA Morning Huddle, May 31, 2023

House lawmakers voted 289-133 to pass the <u>Halt All Lethal Trafficking of Fentanyl Act</u> that would permanently classify all fentanyl-related substances as Schedule I drugs under the Controlled Substances Act. The bill, which received support from the Biden administration, would create a new registration process for Schedule I research and impose similar penalties for offenses involving fentanyl analogues and fentanyl-related substances, among other provisions.

Dental manifestations of celiac disease can include delayed eruption in children and dental enamel defects in children and adults, and they may be the only signs of the disease for those who have not been diagnosed, according to a review in the <u>Journal of Clinical Medicine</u>. "Dentists can play an important role in identifying people who may have unrecognized celiac disease and may help prevent its progress and long-term complications," researchers wrote.

ADA intellectual property includes CDT

The ADA issued a reminder that it is the copyright owner of the Current Dental Terminology, the Code on Dental Procedures and Nomenclature and the ADA Dental Claim Form, and that the CDT is intellectual property developed by the ADA Council on Dental Benefit Programs' Code Maintenance Committee. A license to use the CDT is not required for dentists, dental teams and hospitals.

Dentists are urged to confirm with vendors that they have a licensed to include the CDT in their software.

JADA study compares cements' effect on restoration color

Results for the opaque cement were influenced by thickness and resin shade but translucent cement did not affect the color, researchers said.

HPI data show increase in dentists affiliated with DSOs

The number of dentists across the US affiliated with dental support organizations totaled 13% in 2022, compared with 10.4% in 2019 and 8.8% in 2017, according to ADA Health Policy Institute data. Dentists who have been out of dental school for less than 10 years were more likely to be affiliated with a DSO, at 23%, versus 11% for those who had not been in dental school for 11 to 25 years and 7% for those who had been out of school for more than 25 years.

More than 500,000 people disenrolled from Medicaid

New CDC Guidance on Masking in Healthcare Facilities

What's Up Wednesdays, May 31, 2023

With the end of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency in the U.S., the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recently announced new guidance to help dentists determine how to best implement mask use in their offices. Dentists are still required to follow standard and transmission-based precautions when treating patients, including wearing proper personal protective equipment and adhering to Occupational Safety and Health Administration workplace safety rules and state and local requirements regarding masking.

The new CDC guidance provides information for dentists with questions about broader masking in health care facilities, suggesting that facilities consider the following factors:

- The types of patients the facility treats, including those who may have a higher risk for severe COVID-19
- Input from stakeholders like patients and office personnel
- Plans from other facilities with which the facility shares patients
- Available data, such as local COVID-19 incidence data
