Increasing worldwide percentages of older adults and their associated multiple chronic systemic diseases present many challenges to those providing oral health care. In this presentation, we will address issues such as the higher retention of teeth by older adults, the importance of assessing the patient's capabilities and functionality, the critical need for multiple ongoing prevention strategies, advanced periodontal care, early detection of root caries, appropriate selection of restorative materials, and tooth substitutes within the context of frequent findings seen with older adult patients.

ADA CDEL AAL/ITL Teacher Scholarship Announcement

The ADA Council on Dental Education and Licensure is granting three (3) tuition scholarships to the Academy for Advancing Leadership's Institute for Teaching and Learning (AAL/ITL) — as part of a commitment to support dental education and ADA general dentist members interested in serving full or part-time in dental academia.

The ITL program is presented as a four-day onsite program with class discussions, small-group projects, problem-solving exercises, self-directed coursework, peer feedback, and presentations by ITL Scholars. The 2024 program will be offered on August 26-29, 2024 at the ADA Headquarters Building. Although individuals may apply at any time during the year, the 2024 deadline is March 29, 2024. Scholarships will be granted by May 16. Each scholarship is in the amount of ITL tuition (\$3,500).

About the Program

The District's Address Confidentiality Program (ACP), administered by the Office of Victim Services and Justice Grants (OVSJG), helps people at risk of harm stay safe by shielding their street address from public records. ACP services are intended as one tool in an individual's broader safety plan.

This free program provides participants with:

- · A legal substitute address to protect their home, work, or school address
- A confidential mail-forwarding service.



Who Is It For?

You may qualify for the ACP if you:

- fear for your safety;
- (2) currently (or will soon) reside in the District of Columbia; AND
- Have experienced domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking;
 - Are employed by an organization whose primary purpose is serving victims who have experienced the above offenses; OR
 - Are employed by an organization that focuses on reproductive healthcare.

Applicants are also required to: have moved within the past 60 days, be planning to move within the next 30 days, or have taken adequate measures to ensure their current address is not easily accessible online or through public records. Both adults and children may qualify.



How to Apply

Application assistants are available in several agencies across the District to answer questions, verify eligibility, and accept applications. They also can provide advocacy services and help you develop a comprehensive safety plan based on your individual needs.

How Does the ACP Work?

Substitute Address

Applicants who qualify receive an ACP **authorization card** with a substitute address. This card can be presented to any DC agency in place of your real home, work, or school address. Authorization cards are initially valid for 3 years.

With this legal substitute address you can interact with DC agencies without fear of your actual address appearing in public records. With a substitute address you can:

- Get a DC driver's license or ID card
- Enroll children in DC public/charter school
- Vote and sign petitions

While only District agencies are required to honor the substitute address, placing it on a DC driver's license or ID card will protect your actual address in many day-to-day situations.

Mail Forwarding

When first-class, certified, or registered mail is received at the substitute address, it is forwarded to your home address.

Limitations

A substitute address does not guarantee your actual address will not be required by other non-government agencies. Your real address will still be required for certain activities, including:

- Purchasing a home or property. (Note that the address may appear in related public listings.)
- Applying for a line of credit on your home.
- Setting up utilities for your home.

Additionally, the ACP does not forward junk mail, packages, or magazines; an advocate or application assistant can help you plan for safely receiving that mail. Other limitations may also apply.


